ADS are community-based programs providing a structured, safe environment for cognitively and/or functionally impaired adults (18+yrs). These impairments may be a result of a head injury, dementia, developmental disability, stroke, chronic illness, or frailty. ADS provides daily exercises and meaningful activities (e.g., crafts, games, gardening, cooking) carried out in a group setting that focuses on enhancing and improving functional abilities. Fun, laughter, and friendship are natural outcomes for program participants as they socialize and take part in activities. ADS provides a safe place so that caregivers can work, rest, and take care of other responsibilities. This program is funded through Medi-Cal or private pay.
