Sutter is an agricultural county in the northern part of the Central Valley, between the Sacramento and Feather rivers, named for the Sutter Buttes Mountains.

In 2000, the median age was older than the state of California by about 1 year. One of every 8 people was over 65 years of age and one in 63 was 85 or older. Nearly one in 4 adults was 65+ or disabled.

Unemployment was high at 12.3% (2001), nearly double that of California. There were projected to be 89 job openings for RNs in the region and an estimated 175 direct care nursing staff needed in facilities (2000). Average hourly wages (2001):

In Sutter County nearly one in every 6 persons was eligible for Medi-Cal. In Sutter nearly one in every 6 persons was Medi-Cal eligible. One of every 45 persons in the county was 65+ and a Medi-Cal recipient.

The median home price was not available (2001). Housing vacancy rates in 2000 were higher than California statewide averages: homeowners at 1.5%; rentals at 4.8%.

Sutter had more individuals 65+ (21.7%) and 65+ living alone (8.6%) than California. Of those over 65, one in 2.9 were living alone (34.8%).

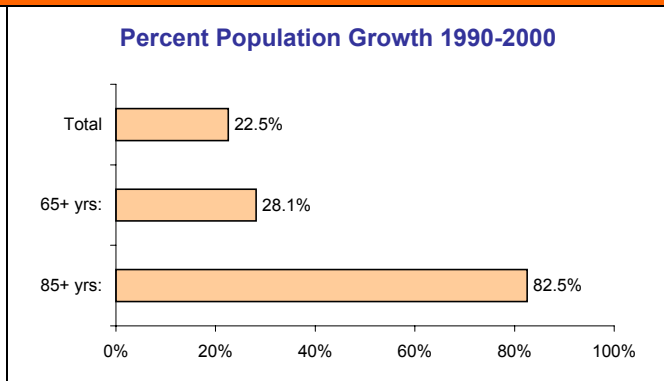

Demographic Trends

In the last decade, Sutter County's population grew at a much faster pace than California, including those over 65 and over 85.

In 2000, Sutter had 40% non-Whites, compared to California's statewide average of 53% non-Whites. Nearly one of every 4 persons in the county was Latino/Hispanic; one in every 9 was Asian; and one in every 32 persons was multi-racial. Looking at age and ethnicity: one in every 10 persons was 65+/White; one in 90 was 65+/Asian; and one in 109 was 65+/Hispanic/Latino.

The median household income was \$9,100 less than California's, with many people living below the poverty level--more than one in 6.
